August's President's Message

Friends,

This month we will commemorate the fast day of Tisha B'Av, with an evening service on Monday, August 12, 8:00pm at BHBI. Tisha B'Av is noted as the day on which numerous calamities befell the Jewish people. Among those calamities, one of the most notable was the destruction of the 2nd Temple in Jerusalem in 70 CE, an event that resulted in the end of Jewish sovereignty in the land, and the exile of many of the people to other parts of the Roman Empire. The Roman general leading the final siege of Jerusalem was Titus, son of the Emperor Vespasian. A little known fact is that Titus' counselor and chief-of-staff at this time was an Egyptian Jew, the Roman general Tiberius Julius Alexander, who came from a wealthy Jewish family in Alexandria and was the nephew of the eminent Jewish philosopher Philo. The Roman-Jewish War and the siege of Jerusalem was a time of great discord and internal conflict among the Jews of Judea. The Zealots were a political movement that incited the rebellion against Rome. The aligned Sicarii were assassins that attacked and killed Jews they regarded as apostates and Roman collaborators. During the siege, the Zealots destroyed the stores of food and supplies in Jerusalem, and forbade any of the Jews from leaving Jerusalem, in order to spur the Jews on to fight the Romans out of desperation. While Jerusalem fell to the Romans, Judaism was saved by the efforts of the Jewish Pharisaic sage <u>Yohanan ben Zakkai</u>, who had opposed the war. Ben Zakkai had himself smuggled out of Jerusalem in a coffin, and made a deal with the Roman general Vespasian (not yet the Emperor) to let him set up a yeshiva in Yavneh. It was this yeshiva, which functioned as a reestablishment of the Sanhedrin, that decreed that daily prayer would become the substitute for the animal sacrifices previously conducted in the Temple, and so became the origin of today's Rabbinic Judaism. Later in the Talmud (Yoma 9b), the Rabbis declared that the reason for the destruction of the 2nd Temple was *sinat chinum*, baseless hatred. "But why was the Second Temple destroyed, seeing that in its time they occupied themselves with Torah, mitzvot and acts of kindness? Because baseless hatred prevailed. This teaches you that baseless hatred is equal to the three sins of idolatry, illicit relations and murder."

We are coming into the last stretch of summer, which means that it is time for our annual BHBI picnic! The picnic will take place on Sunday, August 18. See page 2 for further information. I hope to see you there!
